Borough Codes

The Borough website provides a complete list of town codes and ordinances. Below are brief summaries of select ordinances. Please refer to the official version for precise information.

Burn barrels

Only paper can be burned — all other household rubbish must be hauled away. Burning is only permitted during daylight hours on Tuesday, Thursday, or Saturday. Barrels must be attended at all times, covered with a screen, and not allowed to smolder.

Weeds and grass

Grass and weeds must be no more than 6 inches high.

Speeding and Stop Signs

The police frequently monitor traffic for speeding and complying with stop signs.

Sidewalks

Snow and ice on sidewalks must be cleared within 24 hours after the snowfall stops.

Heaving sidewalks: the maximum permissible vertical gap is 1 inch.

Soliciting

A permit is required for door-to-door soliciting.

Junk

Junk in yards and junk vehicles: Vehicles parked on Borough streets must be registered and in working order. The official ordinance defines *junk* as materials which are "worn out, discarded, rubbish, or scrap materials."

Curbside Stick and Brush Pickup once in the Spring and once in the Fall (3 inches max. diameter)

Snow Plowing The State plows Vine and Market Streets, and the Borough plows all the other streets and alleys.
